## Typical Activities

### Giving Tree

Parishioners brighten the Christmas of needy children and adults by taking a tag from the Giving Tree and purchasing a gift. For Easter parishioners purchase supermarket gift certificates to be distributed through St. Anne's Human Services.

### The Mustard Seed

The Mustard Seed on Piedmont Street in Worcester is a soup kitchen open nightly for evening meals. Ministry members prepare, deliver, and serve a hot meal once a month. There are 100 to 125 people served nightly. All in need are welcome and there is no charge.

### The CROP Walk

The CROP Walk, which takes place in the Fall, is an arm of the Church World Services whose mission is to address worldwide hunger. Ministry members participate and encourage Parish participation and sponsorship in a 6 mile walk. Of the total monies raised 25% stays in Shrewsbury and given to the Worcester County Food Bank to be distributed through St. Anne's Food Pantry.

## Refugee Apostolate

Every Tuesday and Friday, Ministry members go to Price Chopper supermarket in Shrewsbury to collect leftover bread, muffins, and pastries and deliver them to the Refugee Apostolate in Worcester. The Apostolate is an inner-city resource for the urban poor. Open to the public Monday through Saturday, those in need can purchase bread products for a small donation commensurate with the ability to pay.
