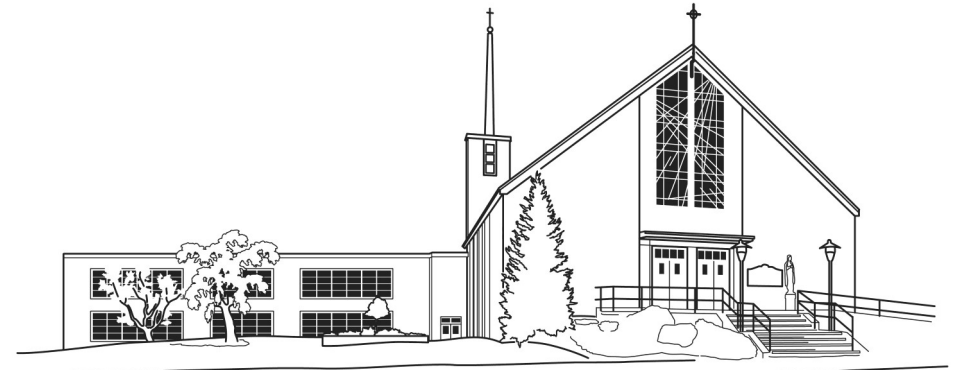

Annual Scholarship & Development Fund Golf Tournament

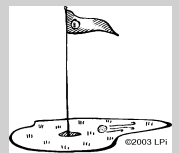

Care of our Common Home

As summer approaches, the Environmental Stewardship Ministry of St. Mary's Parish encourages you to use environmentally sustainable alternatives to *disposable* plastic bottles. Single use plastic bottles are made of Polyethylene terephthalate (PET) which takes 400 years to naturally decompose. Although this is highly recyclable, it is estimated that globally, a million plastic bottles are purchased per minute and 91% of these are not recycled. The majority of plastic bottles end up in landfills or in water sources. Sadly, each square mile of the ocean contains thousand pieces of floating plastic.

An increase in the purchase and use of *multi-use* water bottles will reduce the production of *single-use* plastic water bottles, thereby reducing the likelihood of these ending up in landfills and oceans.
